What is Cleft Lip & Palate (CLP)?

Cleft Lip and/or Palate (CLP) is a common congenital condition where parts of the upper lip and/or the roof of the mouth fail to fuse properly during fetal development.

What is Cleft Lip & Palate (CLP)?

CLP is a birth defect where the upper lip or roof of the mouth doesn't form properly during early pregnancy, affecting appearance, feeding, speech, and breathing. It occurs in about 1 in 700 births globally, with higher rates in Asians and lower rates in Africans.

Caused by a mix of genetic and environmental factors—like maternal illness, smoking, or poor nutrition—CLP often goes untreated in low-income countries due to lack of awareness and access to care. Early detection and surgical intervention greatly improve the quality of life.

Our Focus

CLEFT LIP & PALATE SURGERIES

Chokali Humanitarian Foundation offers free or subsidized cleft lip and palate surgeries across Nigeria, transforming lives in states like Kano, Kaduna, Gombe, and Borno. Beyond surgery, the foundation provides post-op care, speech therapy, nutrition support, and community outreach to reduce stigma and improve access to timely cleft treatment.


HUMANITARIAN RELIEF

Beyond medical care, Chokali Humanitarian Foundation delivers vital relief to communities facing hunger, poverty, and crises. Operating in over 14 states—including Ungogo LGA, Kano—we provide food, hygiene kits, and essentials to vulnerable families. With strong local partnerships, we ensure swift, dignified, and impactful aid delivery.

Chokali Humanitarian Foundation has restored 572 smiles through life-changing cleft surgeries, providing hope and confidence to individuals in need. The foundation has also delivered more than 25,000 in humanitarian relief, supporting vulnerable communities. With a presence in 14+ Nigerian states, it collaborates with 39+ hospitals, healthcare providers, organizations, and individuals to ensure accessible and quality care for cleft patients across the country.

We raise awareness about cleft conditions to reduce stigma and misinformation in Nigerian communities.




Support

ONGOING PROGRAMME

Cleft Awareness and Advocacy Outreach – Jigawa State

CHF conducted a cleft advocacy and awareness programme in Jigawa State to educate communities about cleft lip and palate conditions. The outreach focused on dispelling myths, reducing stigma, and informing families about the availability of free surgical treatment and support services. Community leaders, health workers, and caregivers were engaged to help identify and refer affected individuals. This initiative is part of our commitment to ensuring early intervention and equitable access to cleft care across northern Nigeria.



History CHF



2019

CHF provided free cleft lip and palate surgeries in Kano State, restoring smiles and confidence to those in need. Partnering with hospitals and medical professionals, we ensured safe, high-quality surgical care. This initiative transformed lives and raised awareness on cleft treatment



2020



Our partners include a diverse mix of health institutions, private organizations, healthcare providers, and community-based groups, all working together to expand access to care and support.




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
